From Janet Mitchell- Tucson Garden Railroad Society **Chocolate Raspberry Streusel Squares**

Set oven for 350 degrees.

Combine:

1 1/2 cup all purpose flour

1 1/2 cup Quaker Oats

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 cup packed brown sugar

1 tsp baking powder

1 cup or 2 sticks of margarine

1/4 tsp salt

Reserve 1 cup of this mixture in a separate bowl. Press remainder in un-greased 9" square pan.

Bake 10 minutes.

Spread 1 cup raspberry preserves over crust.

Sprinkle evenly over top:

1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips

1/4 cup chopped almonds

And remaining crust mixture.

Bake 30-35 minutes until golden.
