Waste no time - have your RR running at the scheduled time. Tim is fast at filming so be ready to talk about your layout also. He will not be staying long.


As of this notice, you should have time to get your RR ready to go. We have a lot of nice railroads to show on this DVD for the convention. Don't be left out!
